### **Monday, June 1**

**Arrival in Tel Aviv:** Overnight at the Sheraton Towers Hotel

**Evening:** Our trip will begin with dinner in Tel Aviv with our Scholar in Residence, Dr. Azziza Khazoum who will give an introductory talk providing us with a backdrop for our tour over the next four days.

### **Tuesday, June 2**

Starting our day with a visit to Beit Hatefuzot, we will then make our way to Haifa where we will meet with Ahmediya Muslims, a peace-loving group, have lunch and then visit the Bahai Temple and hear about the Bahai religion before making our way to Mitzpe Hayamim where we will spend the next three nights.

**Evening:** Dinner at the hotel.

### **Wednesday, June 3**

Our first stop of the day will be in Nazareth where we will meet and dialogue with Arab Christians and then visit Hebrew University Jewish /Arab projects in schools situated in this area. After lunch, we will visit Nazareth Illit, where we will meet and dialogue with Ethiopian Jews who have settled in this region.

**Evening:** Dinner in a Circassian Restaurant with a folklore performance.

### **Thursday, June 4**

On Thursday morning we will visit Moshav Kfar Yuval where we will interact with a group of Indian Jews from Cochin and then visit the synagogues of Tzfat, with the possibility of an ethnic lunch prepared by executive chef Andre Elster (also the Kipnes Scholarship recipient) at the new Bed and Breakfast of our guide Jeff Katz. In the afternoon we will visit one of the many archeological sites in the north.

**Evening:** Dinner at Peki'in, a Druze Village where we will learn about and enjoy Druze folklore.

## Friday, June 5

On our way to Jerusalem today, we will stop at an Indian Jewish moshav as well as a Karaite community in Ramle. We will then have lunch at the wonderful Tavlin Restaurant in the Eshtaol area. After lunch we will drive to Jerusalem allowing time to relax and prepare for Shabbat.

**Evening:** Shabbat dinner with the international participants of the Board of Governors of the Hebrew University and senior faculty and doctoral students of the Hebrew University's Interdisciplinary Center for Neurocomputation.
