1. THE JEWISH FOUNDATION OF MANITOBA

Eligibility:

For residents of Manitoba who are Jewish or are in an exclusively Jewish program. Based on academic achievement, involvement in the Jewish community and volunteer activity in the Jewish and/or general community.

Each award has criteria based on the donor's interest.

Possible Award: Up to \$10,000 CAD.

Deadline: The deadlines are February 28 for special awards and March 31 for scholarships.

Awarded to a Jewish student who is attending a university, college or post-graduate program at an educational institution in Israel and who has a strong commitment to the community and volunteerism. This award is based on academic achievement and community involvement both locally and in Israel.

Possible Award: \$5,000 CAD.

2. UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA

Rabbi Dr. Moshe Stern Memorial Award — University of Manitoba

Eligibility:

One scholarship will be available each year for an undergraduate or graduate student who:

- has completed at least 30 credit hours of study in any program at The University of Manitoba;
- has achieved a minimum degree grade point average of 3.0;
- has demonstrated community involvement;
- in the preceding academic session(s) must have taken at least one course in Judaic Studies;
- is an in-course or graduating student who enrolls at the University of Manitoba or any other accredited university (Canadian or International) to pursue Judaic Studies, in the year in which the scholarship is tenable, with the provisos that:
 - (a) a student who is pursuing an academic program of study may register at any accredited university; or
 - (b) if a student chooses to pursue a theological program of study, enrollment must be at an accredited Orthodox Jewish post-secondary institution.

Possible Award: Varies.

Berdie and Irvin Cohen Scholarship – University of Manitoba

Eligibility:

- Have completed at least one year of full-time study at the University of Manitoba or have graduated from the University of Manitoba within the five years immediately preceding application for this scholarship.
- Are admitted to and enroll at Hebrew University in Israel for one year of study in the year in which the scholarship is tenable.
- Have achieved a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.

Possible Award: Varies each year.

Application Process: Applicants will be required to submit an application to the Financial Aid and Awards office.
