

Ontario Scholarships

1. ONTARIO INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility:

- Open to Canadian citizens, permanent residents of Canada (landed immigrants), or protected persons.
- Open to students in an international program of academic credit that is longer than four weeks. Preference is given to students participating in a program longer than two months.
- Open to those demonstrating financial need.
- Demonstrated financial need and a good academic standing.
- The following candidates will be given special consideration:
 - · Aboriginal students.
 - Francophone students.
 - Students with disabilities.

Note: A student is not eligible to apply if they are participating in a Government of Ontario sponsored exchange program i.e. Ontario—Baden-Württemberg.

Possible Award: \$2,500 CAD.

Application Process: Fill out application form (subject to change yearly). These forms are specific to your Ontario University.

2. ONTARIO STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM — OSAP

Eligibility:

Available to students who wish to study at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Students studying abroad are eligible for the Canada portion of the Canada-Ontario Integrated Student Loan.

Possible Award: Needs based.

Application Process: Please visit OSAP site and follow site instructions: https://osap.gov.on.ca/OSAPPortal

Requirements: In almost all cases, money must be paid back. Often, interest payments are waved or reduced.

3. THE MEYER GASNER/JOE BERMAN EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Eligibility:

Open to residents of the GTA only who are planning a year of study in Israel to further their education. For those not eligible for a MASA Israel Journey scholarship.

4. ASSOCIATED HEBREW DAY SCHOOL

Eligibility:

Open to graduates of Associated Hebrew Schools Middle School and those who have attended Associated for at least two years, who propose to enroll in a full year program in Israel (which must be approved by the Scholarship Committee).

Eligibility:

Open to young adults who are going to Israel for a year of study. Open to members and friends of Shaarei Shomayim.

Possible Award: Varies.

7. BETH TZEDEC MEN'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP FUND — NATIONAL

Eligibility:

<u>Not</u> restricted to Beth Tzedec congregants, open to all Canada. Preference will be given to students who study Jewish topics. There are a few specific scholarships for other areas of study: Cantorial, Arts, Social Services - mention these in your application.

Possible Award: Varies per year, up to \$1,000 CAD.

Ontario University Scholarships

***Please Note: Scholarship availability is subject to change.
For the most up to date information please contact your school***

Note: The OSOTF awards refer to a group of awards, which have resulted from Ontario government's "matching" program. Under the program every dollar of donation received for student assistance has been matched by the government as well as the university on a dollar-for-dollar basis.

Eligibility:

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Be a Ontario resident as defined by:
 - a) Have lived in Ontario for a period of at least 12 consecutive months up to the beginning of full-time post-secondary study; or
 - b) The student's spouse has lived in Ontario for at least 12 consecutive months up to the beginning of the current year full-time post-secondary study period; or
 - c) The student's parent(s)/step-parent(s)/legal guardian/official sponsor has lived in Ontario for at least 12 consecutive months up to the beginning of the current year full-time post-secondary study period; financial need as determined by the University).

1. YORK UNIVERSITY

Eligibility:

- All scholarships are open to any full-time York student, who has completed at least one full year at York; they are generally not awarded to students for whom the year in Israel will be their last at York.
- For undergraduates, preference will be given to students completing their second year of full-time studies. The academic record of applicants will be given considerable weight. Minimum of B average is usually required in order to be considered. Selection criteria for the scholarships include academic excellence, participation in university life, seriousness of interest, suitability of the host institution's program for your particular degree requirements, and, where indicated, proof of financial need.

Possible Award: See below.

Application Process: Scholarship applicants must submit:

- A statement of purpose, outlining the projected program of studies in Israel, explaining how that program complements studies at York.
- Official transcripts of all university courses taken.
- Two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a York faculty member.
- For OSOTF scholarships a financial need statement must also be filed.

Please note that a personal interview may be required.

Requirements: York undergraduate students in Israel register and pay tuition to their host university. Credits may be counted towards the York degree.

Graduate students must make appropriate arrangements with the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

POSSIBLE AWARDS:

The Gertrude and Jack Friedman Memorial Award

Given annually to assist a York University student in Jewish Studies, preferably a graduate student, to pursue a program of study and/or research at an Israeli university. In the event that in any year no suitable graduate candidate applies, the award may be given to an outstanding undergraduate in the field of Jewish Studies or Jewish Teacher Education. The value of the award is approximately \$900 CAD.

For these scholarships below, preference is given to students currently enrolled at York in Jewish Studies — especially Jewish Teacher Education.

A) Hebrew University Scholarship

Given annually to a York student for one year of full-time study at the Hebrew University, Jerusalem. The value of the award is for tuition and room.

B) Leonard Wolinsky Scholarship

Given annually to two York undergraduates for one year of full-time study at an Israeli university. The value of the award is \$2,500 CAD.

Eligibility for these scholarships below is strictly limited to Ontario residents, and financial need must be demonstrated.

A) Canadian Friends of the Hebrew University OSOTF Scholarship

Given annually to one or more York graduate or undergraduate students in any area of study for full-time study at Hebrew University. The value of the awards is based on financial need and variable to a maximum of \$25,000 CAD for a year of graduate study, \$18,000 CAD for a year of undergraduate study, and \$2,500 CAD for summer study. For one semester, the maximum is half the full year sum.

B) Leonard Wolinsky OSOTF Scholarship

Given annually to one or more York undergraduate or graduate students for one year's full-time study at an Israeli University. The value of the awards is based on financial need and variable to a maximum of \$2,500 CAD.

C) Berek and Regina Gertner OSOTF Bursary in Holocaust Studies

Given annually to a graduate or undergraduate student who has demonstrated interest in Holocaust studies by virtue of course work or research projects. The award may be used for study in Israel. It is based on financial need, and its value is variable to a maximum of \$1,200 CAD.

D) Esther Sarick OSOTF Bursaries in Jewish Studies and the Arts

Given annually for the support of graduate and undergraduate students in Israel. The usual amount of the award is \$500 CAD. The maximum sum available is \$5,000 CAD.

2. UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO

Andrea and Charles Bronfman Student Awards in Israeli Studies

Eligibility Criteria:

- Must be an undergraduate or graduate student in the Faculty of Arts and Science who is traveling to Israel for study or research, or who is pursuing study or research related to Israel (in Canada). Undergraduate students must be in their third or fourth year of study; minimum CGPA for consideration is 2.50.
- Students may apply for either travel or non-travel awards.
 Preference will be given to requests for travel support.
- Financial need will be considered. Undergraduate students must demonstrate financial need by qualifying for OSAP for the fall-winter sessions in which the application is made. Graduate students must demonstrate financial need by qualifying for OSAP or by submitting a Financial Needs Assessment Form for the fall-winter sessions in which the application is made.
- Please note: international students are not eligible.

Value:

Travel awards: To be determined on the basis of estimated costs (see below).

Non-travel awards: \$500 CAD (undergraduate); \$1,500 CAD (graduate).

Travel awards are paid at the time of travel; non-travel awards are paid after re-registration in the next fall session at the University of Toronto.

Applications:

Applications are composed of 6 parts that must be submitted together. Please ensure applications are complete upon submission. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Applications must include applicant's student number and current mailing address.

- 1. Application Summary Form.
- 2. One-page statement outlining the student's program of study and/or research interests.
- 3. Curriculum vitae.
- 4. Detailed breakdown of estimated costs (travel awards only).
- 5. One-page letter of support from a University of Toronto faculty member (must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the application).
- 6. Copy of the applicant's OSAP assessment (undergraduate/graduate students) or a Financial Needs Assessment Form (graduate students).

Centre for Jewish Studies — U of T

Undergraduate awards are given either on the basis of marks in a particular course or financial need. Financial need is assessed by whether a student qualifies for OSAP. This is why all students should apply for OSAP, whether they need the money or not, because OSAP eligibility opens up a wide variety of scholarships and awards that would otherwise not be open to students.

Two of the more relevant scholarships offered out of the Jewish studies department are listed below:

A) Travel Grant for Graduate Research or Study in Israel

Through the generous donation from Canadian Friends of the Hebrew University, a travel grant has been established to assist MA or PhD students to conduct research or study in Israel. Awarded on the basis of financial need to full-time graduate students. Applications available in early spring at the SGS Graduate Award Office.

B) Abraham Isaac Silver Scholarship in Jewish Studies

Eligibility: (For Any Year) — Awarded to a student who has been accepted for the International Summer Program in Jerusalem. If the Jerusalem Program is not offered, awarded to a student enrolled in a Program in Jewish Studies.

Coburn Award — Victoria University (U of T)

Eligibility:

- This program is open to all students who want to study at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. He/she must currently be studying in the Faculty of Arts and Science at the University of Toronto, but Victoria College students will get first priority. Students must be studying in the fields of the Humanities or Fine Arts.
- Students will be selected on the basis of academic or artistic excellence and their ability to benefit from study abroad.
 Students should have at least a B+ average (GPA 3.30+).

Possible Award: Up to \$20,000 CAD towards a year of study in Israel.

Application Process:

- Each applicant must submit a Study Abroad bursary application: http://www.vic.utoronto.ca/students/ financial_matters/bursaries/coburn.htm
- Transcript.
- Two academic letters of recommendation from faculty who have taught him/her.
- A cover letter explaining his/her interest in study Hebrew University and his/her goals.
- Also include information on how you intend to fund your year abroad and list other awards or scholarships received.

Requirements: Students must meet the admission requirements at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. They must register in full-time studies for the academic year.

UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN ONTARIO

Canadian Friends of Hebrew University of Jerusalem Awards

Eligibility:

- Awarded to graduate or undergraduate students in any year or any program wishing to study abroad at the Hebrew U, for full year, semester or summer courses, based on demonstrated financial need and academic achievement.
- These awards are open to students in affiliated colleges as well as students at the constituent university.

Possible Award: Awards will be granted as funds permit, and based on applications received up to a total of \$30,000 CAD annually. Distribution may change subject to an annual review by the donor:

- Up to \$15,000 CAD for full-time graduate study abroad.
- Up to \$10,000 CAD for full-time undergraduate study abroad.
- Up to \$5,000 CAD for one semester of graduate or undergraduate study.
- Up to \$1,500 CAD for summer undergraduate study.
