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## Dear IMPH Alumni,

The 48th IMPH cohort graduated on September 11, 2023, with a very beautiful and moving ceremony, and has joined the remarkable community of IMPH alumni, bringing pride to their families, nations, as well as to the Braun School, Hebrew University, and Hadassah.

We were fortunate to have with us at the ceremony, among the many distinguished guests, Sir Trevor, and Lady Pears, of the Pears Foundation. We closed the ceremony with an Israeli song of hope for the upcoming year, that was sang jointly by our students and teachers. The translated words of the chorus are “you will see how good it will be in the year to come.” Little did we know then what a terrible time awaited us.



On Saturday October 7, Hamas terrorists entering the South of Israel from the Gaza strip, massacred over 1,400 people, wounded over 3000, and kidnapped over 200 people, including women, children and elderly. The humanitarian crisis and loss of innocent lives in Gaza, due to Israel's response to these atrocities, should be acknowledged as well. The impact of this catastrophe is tremendous, and it will take a long time to fully appreciate its implications.

In the micro-cosmos of the Hebrew University, a committee was formed from among Jewish and Arab faculty and staff to address the tensions created by the war. The committee sent out a joint message to the management of the Hebrew University. Quoting the first paragraph of the message: “The horrific massacre perpetrated by Hamas on October 7th, 2023 left all of us - Jews and Arabs - shocked, heartbroken, and angry. The families or acquaintances of many members of the Hebrew University were killed or harmed in Hamas's attack. Many members of the community have been called up from reserves, and many of our Arab students have family members and acquaintances in Gaza. The challenging days of war that we are experiencing are accompanied by loss, grief, and profound pain.” These words convey something of the complexity and the pain this war brings to everyone involved, be it directly or indirectly.

Given the situation, the opening of the academic year in all Israeli universities has been postponed, and our students of the 49th IMPH cohort are awaiting its beginning in their home countries. This year's cohort includes 22 IMPH students from 14 countries, 11 women and 11 men, with varied professional and cultural backgrounds. We have started remote teaching two weeks ago and although we are being challenged by technical issues, familiar to us from the time of the pandemic, all students are fully committed and enthusiastic. We are very hopeful that our students will be able to join us in Jerusalem in several weeks.

Knowing our remarkable group of alumni, I trust that you are all engaged in doing good globally. I hope to meet many of you at our IMPH Alumni Conference in Nairobi in May 2024. The global challenges of Public Health are huge, dynamic and ever-growing. At times these challenges feel overwhelming. Yet, it is our duty to do whatever we can to cope with them, to relentlessly work for the well-being of communities around the world. Even at times of uncertainty, especially in these times, we must not lose sight of the core missions in Public Health: Preventing suffering, delaying and averting disability, promoting social justice, and above holding on to our humanity. The alumni community is a resource of mutual learning and support, solidarity and inspiration. We can and should rely on each other's knowledge, experience and assistance to promote global health.

Wishing us and our world peace and health.

# Community Oriented Primary Care Workshop - Loni, Maharashtra, India

The International COPC workshop, jointly organized by the Hebrew University-Hadassah Braun School of Public Health and Community Medicine, and the School of Public Health and Social Medicine (SPHSM) at Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences – Deemed to be University, Loni, India, took place from July 31 to August 03, 2023. Professor Yehuda Neumark from the Braun School spearheaded the coordination and content delivery for the workshop, with invaluable support from IMPH alumni Dr. Ruchi Verma, Kandarp Talati, Nidhi Mankar, and Mridula Kapil Bhargava. Dr. Maureen Malowany, Alumni Academic Coordinator from Braun School, also provided guidance and oversight.

The workshop kicked off on July 31, 2023, with a memorable ceremonial event attended by Dr. V. N. Magare, Vice Chancellor of the University. Esteemed students and faculty members from the constituent colleges joined in the festivities. Professor K. V. Somasundaram, Dean of the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences at PIMS (DU), set the stage by introducing the luminaries and resource persons. Professor Yehuda then led an introductory session which sensitized participants to the fundamentals of epidemiology, emphasizing its pivotal role in evidence-based decision making.



On the second day, workshop participants were divided into four teams, each of which had a mix of undergraduate and post-graduate students, an approach which enhanced the collective learning experience. The COPC workshop was characterized by its dynamic and engaging pedagogy, which participants greatly appreciated. The content delivery was not only informative but also infused with moments of levity, fostering an enriching learning environment while delivering a public health toolkit. The community and health facility visits provided participants with invaluable insights into local health needs and conditions. These experiences offered fresh perspectives, enabling participants to better conceptualize and design locally adaptable public health interventions.

Participants and organizers appreciated the design of the workshop, the approachability of resource persons and the interactive shared learning approach. Alumni played a pivotal role in co-facilitating the workshop alongside Professor Yehuda, under the guidance of Dr. Maureen. This interaction allowed alumni to reconnect with their mentors and share their IMPH insights and professional skills with the next generation of public health professionals.

## Amal Khayat

(Jerusalem | IMPH 2017)

Amal Khayat is a Palestinian from East Jerusalem. Amal completed her undergraduate degree in Pharmacology at Al-Quds University in the West Bank and completed two international graduate programs at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem; Glocal Community Development Studies and the International master's in public health, IMPH. Amal is currently pursuing her PhD in Public Health at the Hebrew University, under the supervision of Dr. Yael Bar-Zeev and Prof. Hagai Levine. This academic year, Amal became a junior faculty member at the Department of Nutritional Sciences, at The Robert F. Smith Faculty of Agriculture, Food and Environment, teaching international students and is working as a teaching assistant at Glocal. In addition, Amal is a fellow of the George Pinto Jerusalem Leadership Fellows Program with the Jerusalem Foundation and is working with students from East Jerusalem studying Social Work at the Hebrew University as part of her fellowship.

In September, Amal was invited to speak at a gathering held by the British Friends of the Hebrew University in London. Amal spoke about her experience growing up in a segregated neighborhood in East Jerusalem, having some of her most meaningful encounters with “the other side” thanks to her studies at the Hebrew University, and learning the importance of having more Palestinian students studying at Israeli academic institutions. Amal was granted a prestigious award for socially engaged PhD candidates from the Hadassah Medical Center, based on her volunteer work and academic excellence.

Amal is a peace activist and a fellow of “Solutions not Sides”, a UK-based educational charity that helps counter antisemitism and Islamophobia in the UK by teaching about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict from a humanitarian perspective, through the personal stories and political knowledge of Israeli and Palestinian peace activists.
